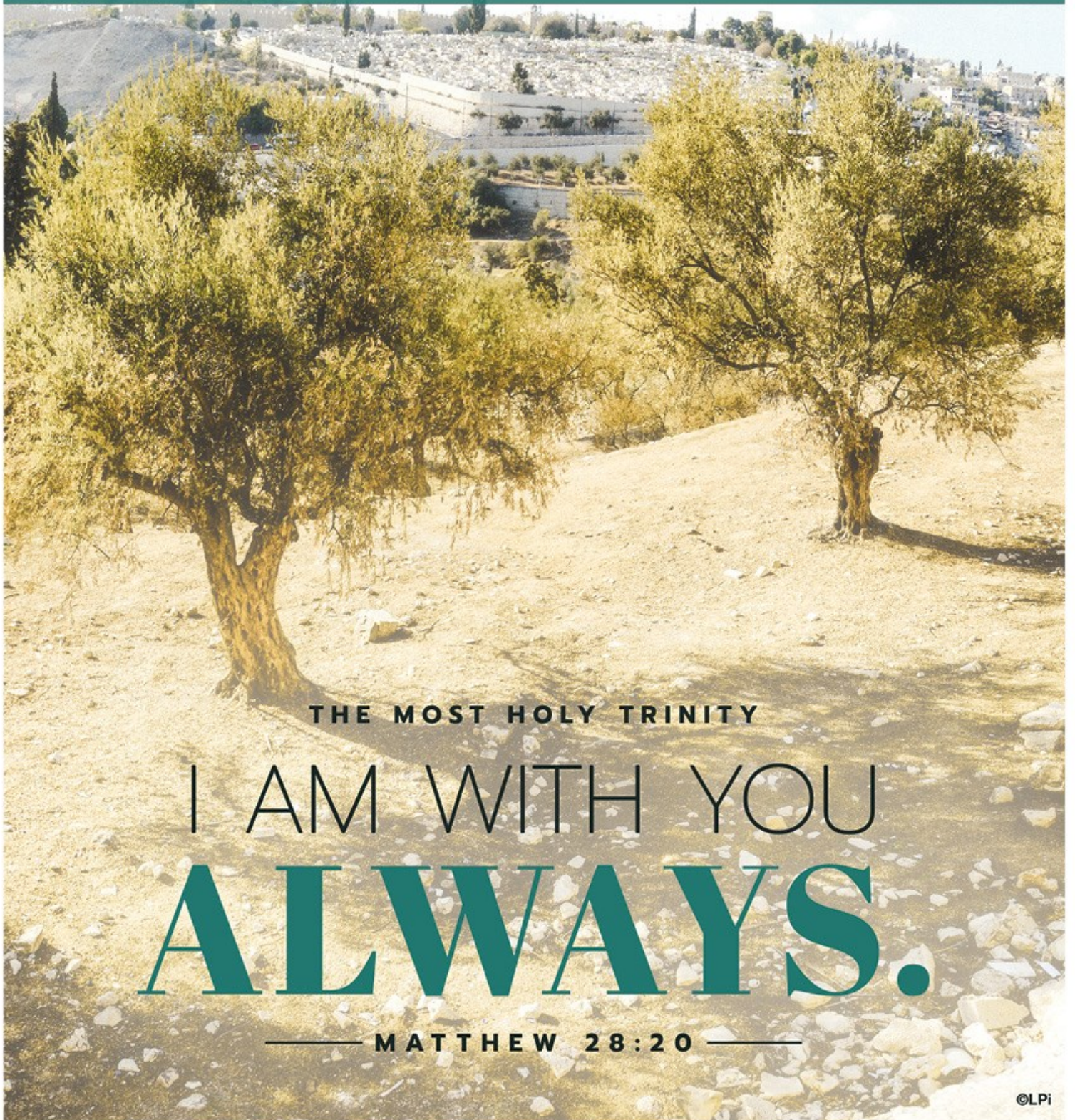

## DID YOU KNOW THIS ABOUT ST. MARY?

### Rev. Francis P. Leipzig 1929 - 1950

The new pastor who succeeded Father O'Hara in January 1929 was the Reverend Frances P. Leipzig. Although he had a different personality, he had been active in many of the same pursuits as Father O'Hara. He had organized a Newman Club at Oregon State Agricultural College where he was pastor from 1922-1929. He had promoted Sunday school and religious vacation schools. Father Leipzig had also attended several of the National Catholic Rural Life Conferences. He continued these activities during his term as pastor at St. Mary in Eugene. Here, he faced challenges previous priests had encountered, but with greater intensity than they had ever experienced.

The first of these challenges was the \$97,500 debt incurred in building the new church. During the Great Depression, which began in the fall of 1929, the parish income scarcely met the interest. At the time, there were only two hundred fifty to three hundred Catholic families in the Eugene area, many of whom were hard hit by the depression. Nevertheless, a second collection at Sunday Masses was introduced and was used to pay the debt. Father Leipzig himself took no salary for several years. With a committee of priests, he worked out a plan, which was used by many other archdiocesan parishes, whereby those who had money to lend could lend it to the archdiocese in favor of their parish at 4% interest. Banks at the time were paying only 3%.

At this time, there was talk of suspending part or all of the high school for a few years, and enrollment in St. Mary's School declined somewhat for the first time since 1916. Families kept their children in school by paying their Christian Family Dues by donating produce from their farms or by helping with the custodial and other labor. Father Leipzig with the Sisters, students, and parents made sacrifices and the hard times were weathered without closing any classes.

As the nation's economy began to recover, school enrollment climbed back to pre-Depression numbers, and by 1943, it exceeded three hundred. Payments on the church debt were maintained, and it was entirely paid off by May 1945. Only God and those involved know all the things that Father Leipzig and his assistant, Father Curley, did to help families in crisis during those days.

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### The Most Holy Trinity

Once I was at a meeting with representatives of various religions. On a coffee break, a man from another religion mused to me: “You know, with all our differences, all religions are really about being good people.” I lowered my cappuccino and said as warmly as I could, “That’s not what mine’s about.” His quizzical look begged for clarification. “Mine is about plunging into the life of God,” I said.

Just before Jesus ascends into heaven, he commands the eleven apostles, “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:19-20). The word “baptize” means “to immerse in, to plunge into.” It presupposes the use of water. But what does it mean to be immersed in God’s name? In the Bible, God’s name is identical to God Himself. So, to be baptized into water, using Jesus’ formula, is to be plunged into the life of God. Said another way, it is to die with Jesus and rise with him as a member of his body. The Trinity isn’t a doctrine simply to accept and ponder. It’s more like an ocean: a mystery into which we are baptized ... inserted, immersed, dunked, plunged. Baptism gives us power to live our lives as beloved children of God, patterned after Jesus himself, who is always with us, until the end of the ages. Hardly the same as being good people. Stranger, but much better.

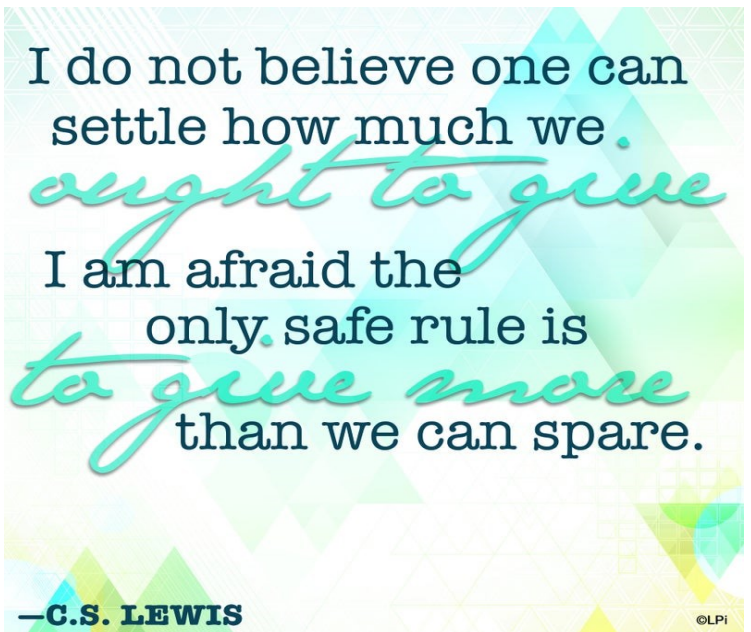

## ¿SABÍAS ESTO SOBRE SANTA MARÍA?

### Rev. Francis P. Leipzig 1929 - 1950

El nuevo párroco que sucedió al padre O'Hara en enero de 1929 fue el reverendo Frances P. Leipzig. Aunque tenía una personalidad diferente, había participado activamente en muchas de las mismas actividades que el padre O'Hara. Había organizado un Club Newman en el Colegio Agrícola del Estado de Oregón, donde fue pastor de 1922 a 1929. Había promovido la escuela dominical y las escuelas religiosas de vacaciones. El padre Leipzig también había asistido a varias de las Conferencias Nacionales Católicas sobre la Vida Rural. Continuó estas actividades durante su mandato como párroco en St. Mary en Eugene. Aquí, enfrentó desafíos que los sacerdotes anteriores habían enfrentado, pero con mayor intensidad de la que jamás habían experimentado.

El primero de estos desafíos fue la deuda de \$97,500 contraída para construir la nueva iglesia. Durante la Gran Depresión, que comenzó en el otoño de 1929, los ingresos de la parroquia apenas cubrían los intereses. En ese momento, sólo había entre doscientas cincuenta y trescientas familias católicas en el área de Eugene, muchas de las cuales fueron duramente afectadas por la depresión. Sin embargo, se introdujo una segunda colecta en las misas dominicales que sirvió para pagar la deuda. El propio padre Leipzig estuvo varios años sin recibir salario. Con un comité de sacerdotes, elaboró un plan, que fue utilizado por muchas otras parroquias arquidiocesanas, mediante el cual aquellos que tenían dinero para prestar podían prestarlo a la arquidiócesis a favor de su parroquia con un interés del 4%. Los bancos en ese momento pagaban sólo el 3%. En ese momento, se habló de suspender parte o la totalidad de la escuela secundaria durante algunos años, y la inscripción en la escuela St. Mary's School disminuyó un poco por primera vez desde 1916. Las familias mantenían a sus hijos en la escuela pagando sus cuotas familiares cristianas por donando productos de sus granjas o ayudando con la custodia y otras labores. El Padre Leipzig con las Hermanas, los alumnos y los padres hicieron sacrificios y se sobrellevó los tiempos difíciles sin cerrar ninguna clase. A medida que la economía del país comenzó a recuperarse, la matrícula escolar volvió a aumentar a las cifras anteriores a la Depresión y, en 1943, superó las trescientas. Se mantuvieron los pagos de la deuda de la iglesia y en mayo de 1945 se saldó íntegramente. Sólo Dios y los involucrados saben todo lo que el padre Leipzig y su asistente, el padre Curley, hicieron para ayudar a las familias en crisis durante aquellos días.
