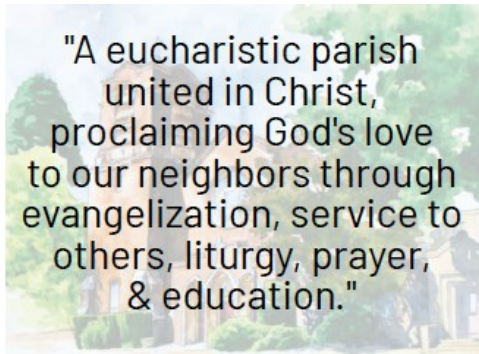

St. Thérèse of Lisieux (1873-1897) was born in France, the youngest of nine children. Her mother died when she was four. Thérèse was described as being sensitive and precocious as a child.

Thérèse experienced a transformative conversion early on when she saw a vision of Mary, Mother of God. She had fallen ill, and the doctors of her time were unable to diagnose or treat her. She experienced fevers, convulsions, and fearful visions. This lasted until, turning her face to the statue of the Blessed Mother near her bedside, she asked Mary to take pity on her. According to her writings, Thérèse said that she experienced a beautiful vision of Mary. In this vision, when Mary smiled upon her, all her pain and illness disappeared. This experience, *The Healing of Our Lady of the Smile*, contributed to setting Thérèse's heart on pursuing religious life.

When Thérèse was 15, she entered the Carmelite convent in Lisieux, France. She took the name Sister Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face and began a life of prayer and intimacy with God. Despite her struggles with depression, she always put her best foot forward. She tragically died of tuberculosis at age 24 but, before her death, she said "My mission – to make God loved – will begin after my death. I will spend my heaven doing good on earth. I will let fall a shower of roses." Now, she is fondly known as Thérèse the Little Flower of Jesus and roses have become a symbol of her intercession.

During her life, Thérèse wrote several essays cataloging her pursuit of holiness that were later published under the title "Story of a Soul." These writings earned her the privilege of being the youngest person to ever be designated a Doctor of the Church and continue to be treasured by Catholics world-wide! St. Thérèse, pray for us!

## DID YOU KNOW THIS ABOUT ST. MARY?

### Rev. Francis P. Leipzig 1929 - 1950

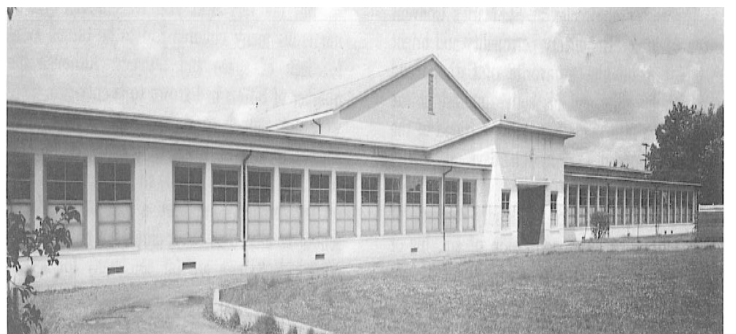
During World War II, the population of the Eugene-Springfield area grew significantly, leading to changes in both the church and school. School enrollment increased from 350 in 1941 to 516 in 1946. By 1943, each grade had its own classroom and teacher, and by 1946, it became necessary to divide grades into more than one class. More classrooms were needed and a new unit was added to the building constructed in 1940. The old church was demolished, and a \$50,000 classroom structure was built. This new building was named the St. Mary Parish Service Center and was dedicated on October 8, 1947, providing two more high school classrooms, a library, and an office.

The following year, there were so many registrations that numerous children had to be turned away due to a lack of space and teachers. Although the number of Sisters had grown to twenty-two, there were not enough to fully staff the school. As a result, a lay teacher named Kathleen Dixon was hired to teach one of the third-grade classes. This marked the beginning of lay teachers being part of the St. Mary school faculty. The following year, class sizes were limited to fifty students, with even children of the parish being turned away.

In 1949, the population of Lane County had doubled since 1929, leading to increased demand for Catholic school facilities. In 1948, over 700 students were enrolled and accommodated in the buildings at 11th & Lincoln. There was much rejoicing in the spring of 1949 when it was announced that plans for a new high school had been approved.

Construction of the new high school began on August 1 on six acres of land at 18th and Jefferson Streets.

The new building, completed by May 29, 1950, included six classrooms, a library, science rooms, administrative offices, and a gymnasium with complete athletic facilities. After its completion, the Sisters and students moved in, and the upper grades moved into the rooms at the "Old St. Mary School." The lower grades remained in the old wooden building. On September 3, 1950, the new high school was dedicated and named St. Francis High School in honor of Father Leipzig, who had contributed significantly to its establishment before being appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Baker, Oregon. ## ¿SABÍAS ESTO SOBRE SANTA MARÍA?

### Rev. Francis P. Leipzig 1929 - 1950

Durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial, la población del área de Eugene-Springfield creció significativamente, lo que llevó a cambios tanto en la iglesia como en la escuela. La matrícula escolar aumentó de 350 en 1941 a 516 en 1946. En 1943, cada grado tenía su propio aula y maestro, y en 1946 se hizo necesario dividir los grados en más de una clase. Se necesitaban más aulas y se agregó una nueva unidad al edificio construido en 1940. La antigua iglesia fue demolida y se construyó una estructura de aulas de \$50,000. Este nuevo edificio recibió el nombre de Centro de Servicio Parroquial Sta. Maria y se inauguró el 8 de octubre de 1947, proporcionando dos aulas más para la escuela secundaria, una biblioteca y una oficina.

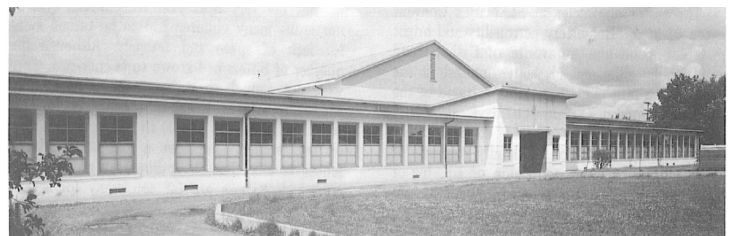
Al año siguiente, hubo tantas inscripciones que hubo que rechazar a numerosos niños por falta de espacio y de profesores. Aunque el número de Hermanas había aumentado a veintidós, no había suficientes para dotar de personal a la escuela. Como resultado, se contrató a una maestra laica llamada Kathleen Dixon para impartir una de las clases de tercer grado. Esto marcó el comienzo de que los maestros laicos formaran parte del cuerpo docente de la escuela Sta. Maria. Al año siguiente, el tamaño de las clases se limitó a cincuenta estudiantes, e incluso se rechazó a los niños de la parroquia.

En 1949, la población del condado de Lane se había duplicado desde 1929, lo que provocó una mayor demanda de instalaciones escolares católicas. En 1948, más de 700 estudiantes estaban matriculados y alojados en los edificios de 11th y Lincoln. En la primavera de 1949 hubo mucho júbilo cuando se anunció que se habían aprobado los planes para una nueva escuela secundaria.

La construcción de la nueva escuela secundaria comenzó el 1 de agosto en seis acres de terreno en las calles 18 y Jefferson. El nuevo edificio, terminado el 29 de mayo de 1950, incluía seis aulas, una biblioteca, salas de ciencias, oficinas administrativas y un gimnasio con instalaciones deportivas completas. Después de su finalización, las Hermanas y los estudiantes se mudaron allí, y los grados superiores se mudaron a las aulas de la antigua escuela de Santa María.

Los grados inferiores permanecieron en el antiguo edificio de madera. El 3 de septiembre de 1950, se inauguró la nueva escuela secundaria y se la llamó San Francisco escuela secundaria en honor al Padre Leipzig, quien había contribuido significativamente a su establecimiento antes de ser nombrado Obispo de la Diócesis de Baker, Oregon.

### CONFIRMATION

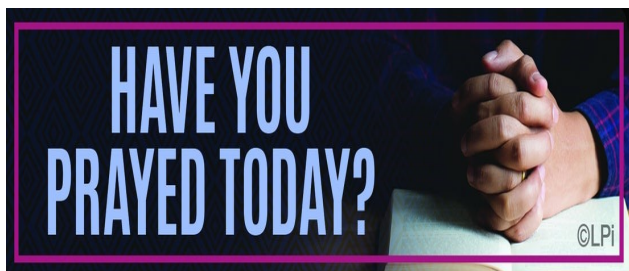
Classes for children grades 7-12, preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation are offered beginning in the fall. Registration is required. Contact: Julie Rutledge.
