Maximillian Schell stars as the "flying friar," St. Joseph Cupertino, in this heartwarming and amazing true story of the humble Franciscan friar who literally rose to sainthood. In the impoverished village of 17th century Cupertino, Italy, Joseph's peasant mother convinces the reluctant Abbott (Ricardo Montalban) to accept her son into the monastery. With the support of the kindly local Bishop who sees in him a great deal more than others do, and by a series of miraculous incidents, the simple but pious Joseph is ordained a priest. Yet some are convinced that it is the devil, not God, who is responsible for Joseph's miraculous powers—until a final miracle reveals to all his true sanctity.

This film is not rated but was created with an adult audience in mind. We would recommend Parental Guidance and that parents preview the film before watching with children.

DID YOU KNOW THIS ABOUT ST. MARY?

Rev. Edmund Murnane 1950-1969

On July 22, 1956, a unique event occurred as three new schools built by one parish, in one year, were dedicated on the same day. Archbishop Howard, accompanied by priests, altar servers, Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus, laypeople, Sisters of the Holy Names, and the Sisters of St. Joseph of Wichita, Kansas, participated in a procession of cars for the dedication. The procession moved from St. Paul's School to St. Peter's School, then to the convent for the Sisters of St. Joseph located at 18th and Jefferson Streets, and finally to St. Mary's Junior High School next to St. Francis High School, with Archbishop Howard blessing each location along the way. St. Paul's and St. Peter's Schools remained part of St. Mary's Parish for a year or two, with assistant priests at St. Mary offering Masses in the schools on Sundays beginning in September 1956. St. Peter became a full-fledged parish in 1957 when Reverend Daniel O'Connell was appointed pastor. Also in 1957, Father Charles Scott became the administrator of St. Paul until 1959, when Father Robert Cieslinski was appointed pastor. The construction of the new schools helped alleviate pressure on St. Mary, but student enrollment remained in the 600s from 1956 to 1963.

Not all Catholic children attended Catholic schools. Father Murnane was concerned about the religious education of those who did not, so he started a Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) program that covered the entire parish. In January 1955, he called a meeting of concerned parents to present the program, and it began in the following fall. At that time, Oregon school law permitted children in public schools to attend religious classes outside of the public school buildings during release time. The Sisters trained a few laywomen to teach these classes in private homes, and despite initial struggles, in 1961 Father Murnane hired Sister Mary Euphemie (Marguerite Fall) as a full-time coordinator of the CCD program. She organized teacher training classes, reached out to public school principals, recruited teachers, arranged babysitters for their children, secured homes for teaching, and provided transportation to and from classes for the children. Eventually, three buses were purchased to serve as mobile classrooms, allowing the program to cover eighteen public schools and serve over 600 enrolled Catholic pupils at its peak. An additional 300 junior and senior high school students participated in programs for their age level. To be continued.

¿SABÍAS ESTO SOBRE SANTA MARÍA?

Rev. Edmund J. Murnane 1929 - 1950

El 22 de julio de 1956, ocurrió un evento único cuando tres nuevas escuelas construidas por una parroquia, en un año, fueron dedicadas el mismo día. El Arzobispo Howard, acompañado por sacerdotes, monaguillos, Caballeros de Colón del Cuarto Grado, laicos, Hermanas de los Santos Nombres y las Hermanas de San José de Wichita, Kansas, participaron en una procesión de autos para la dedicación. La procesión se trasladó de la Escuela San Pablo a la Escuela San Pedro, luego al convento de las Hermanas de San José ubicado en las calles 18 y Jefferson, y finalmente a la Escuela Secundaria Sta. María junto a la Escuela Secundaria San Francisco, con El Arzobispo Howard bendice cada lugar a lo largo del camino. Las escuelas de San Pablo y San Pedro siguieron siendo parte de la parroquia de Sta. María durante uno o dos años, y los sacerdotes asistentes de Sta. María ofrecieron misas en las escuelas los domingos a partir de septiembre de 1956. San Pedro se convirtió en una parroquia de pleno derecho en 1957 cuando el Reverendo Daniel O'Connell fue nombrado pastor. También en 1957, el Padre Charles Scott se convirtió en administrador de San Pablo hasta 1959, cuando el Padre Robert Cieslinksi fue nombrado párroco. La construcción de las nuevas escuelas ayudó a aliviar la presión sobre Sta. María, pero la matrícula de estudiantes se mantuvo en los 600 entre 1956 y 1963.

No todos los niños católicos asistieron a escuelas católicas. El padre Murnane estaba preocupado por la educación religiosa de quienes no la tenían, por lo que inició un programa de Cofradía de Doctrina Cristiana (CCD) que cubría toda la parroquia. En enero de 1955, convocó una reunión de padres preocupados para presentar el programa, que comenzó en el otoño siguiente. En ese momento, la ley escolar de Oregón permitía que los niños de las escuelas públicas asistieran a clases religiosas fuera de los edificios de las escuelas públicas durante el tiempo libre. Las Hermanas capacitaron a algunas mujeres laicas para que impartieran estas clases en hogares privados y, a pesar de las luchas iniciales, en 1961 el Padre Murnane contrató a la Hermana Mary Euphemie (Marguerite Fall) como coordinadora de tiempo completo del programa CCD. Organizó clases de formación docente, contactó a directores de escuelas públicas, reclutó maestros, consiguió niñeras para sus hijos, aseguró hogares para enseñar y proporcionó transporte hacia y desde las clases para los niños. Finalmente, se compraron tres autobuses para que sirvieran como aulas móviles, lo que permitió que el programa cubriera dieciocho escuelas públicas y atendiera a más de 600 alumnos católicos matriculados en su punto máximo. Otros 300 estudiantes de secundaria y preparatoria participaron en programas para su nivel de edad. Continuará
