## CATHOLIC Q & A

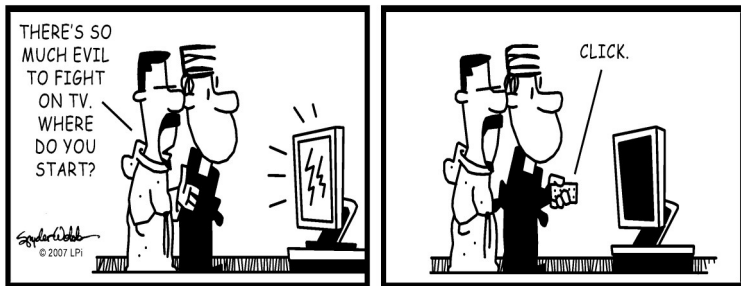
### How do I bring God into the work of my daily life?

Whatever your daily work, you have an opportunity to encounter God and to follow His commandments in love. In the New Testament, we see that most of the Apostles didn't have a previous religious position. They were fishermen, tax collectors, and political activists. St. Paul was a tentmaker. Among the saints, we have doctors, lawyers, farmers, and stay-at-home moms. No matter your daily tasks, God can be present there!

One way concerns behavior. Start with an examination of conscience. Look at areas where you tend to struggle to imitate Christ at work. Do you gossip? Does brimming frustration become impatience at home? Pick one sin you struggle with, then choose a virtue to strengthen that area. If you tend to speak poorly of your co-workers, resolve to stop and to say one kind thing a day instead.

Another way relates to perspective, particularly your perspective of others. Jesus' incarnation reminds us of the value of every human being. Jesus is God, and each of us is created in God's image. When you encounter another person, you have an opportunity to see God in a new place and a new way — in that person in front of you. Genuinely listen to them and be present to their concerns. Loving your neighbor is loving God! Our relationship with God and the love He inspires in our hearts shouldn't remain only at church on Sunday. We can — and should — let our faith animate our lives!

## DID YOU KNOW THIS ABOUT ST. MARY?

### Rev. Francis P. Leipzig 1929 - 1950

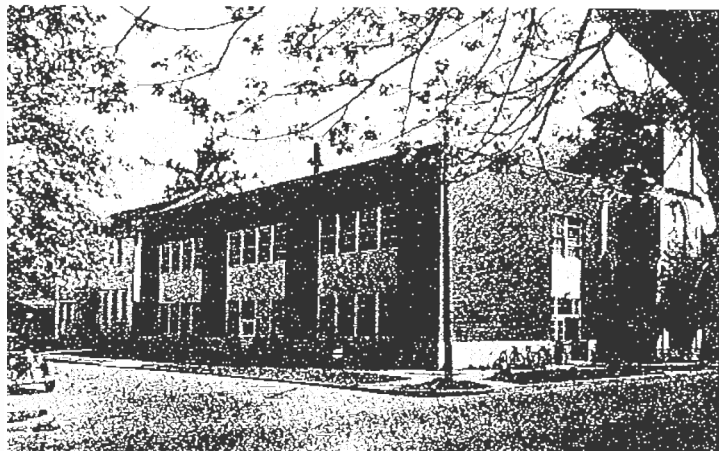
St. Mary's School excelled in both athletic and academic endeavors, as well as spiritual pursuits. Throughout the 1930's many women from St. Mary joined religious orders. In 1931 the first of its graduates to become a priest, James Maxwell, was ordained and offered his first Mass in the parish church. He was followed in 1933 by two more men from St. Mary, Francis Schaefer and John Berger, and in 1936 by Richard Fall. Other graduates had become successful in their careers and remained loyal to the parish.

In 1937, a Mothers Club was formed to help the Sisters address school needs and problems. One of their first projects was a hot lunch program which began in November.

In 1940, the old school building was no longer large enough to accommodate the growing number of students. A new two-story brick building was constructed at the northeast corner of 11th and Lincoln Streets for \$24,000. This new building included three classrooms for high school students, a cafeteria, shower rooms, and a fuel room. At the same time, in honor of Fr. Leipzig, non-Catholic townspeople donated \$2,000 for new bleachers in the gym. The area of the old church-turned-gym that used to be the sacristy was transformed into a typing room and library.

In 1941 the United States entered the European conflict, which naturally affected St. Mary's Parish and School. The students enthusiastically participated in the National Schools at War Program, buying stamps and stars and working hard on war bond drives. On April 19, 1944, a solemn Requiem High Mass was sung for Walter Cole, the first graduate of St. Mary to give his life for his country in this war. Before it was over, ten more parishioners were to make the supreme sacrifice, along with Father Richard Carberry, the former assistant priest and coach, who died as a Japanese prisoner of war.

In 1945, the parishioners of St. Mary's had a double cause for celebration. The war had ended, and the church's debt had been fully paid off. Additionally, they celebrated their beloved pastor's 25th anniversary as a priest. To be continued.

## ¿SABÍAS ESTO SOBRE SANTA MARÍA?

### Rev. Francis P. Leipzig 1929 - 1950

Esquela de Santa María se destacó tanto en sus esfuerzos deportivos como académicos, así como en sus actividades espirituales. A lo largo de la década de 1930, muchas mujeres de Sta. María se unieron a órdenes religiosas. En 1931, el primero de sus graduados en convertirse en sacerdote, James Maxwell, fue ordenado y ofreció su primera misa en la iglesia parroquial. Le siguieron en 1933 dos hombres más de Sta. Maria, Francis Schaefer y John Berger, y en 1936 Richard Fall. Otros graduados habían tenido éxito en sus carreras y permanecieron leales a la parroquia.

En 1937, se formó un Club de Madres para ayudar a las Hermanas a atender las necesidades y problemas escolares. Uno de sus primeros proyectos fue un programa de almuerzos calientes que comenzó en noviembre.

En 1940, el edificio de la antigua escuela ya no era lo suficientemente grande para albergar al creciente número de estudiantes. Se construyó un nuevo edificio de ladrillo de dos pisos en la esquina noreste de las calles 11 y Lincoln por \$24,000. Este nuevo edificio incluía tres aulas para estudiantes de secundaria, una cafetería, aseos y una sala de combustible. Al mismo tiempo, en honor del P. En Leipzig, los habitantes no católicos donaron 2.000 dólares para nuevas gradas en el gimnasio. El área de la antigua iglesia convertida en gimnasio que solía ser sacristía se transformó en sala de mecanografía y biblioteca.

En 1941 Estados Unidos entró en el conflicto europeo, que naturalmente afectó a la parroquia y escuela de Sta. Maria. Los estudiantes participaron con entusiasmo en el Programa Nacional de Escuelas en Guerra, compraron estampillas y estrellas y trabajaron arduamente en campañas de bonos de guerra. El 19 de abril de 1944, se cantó una solemne Misa de Réquiem por Walter Cole, el primer graduado de Sta. Maria que dio su vida por su país en esta guerra. Antes de que terminara, diez feligreses más debían hacer el sacrificio supremo, junto con el padre Richard Carberry, ex sacerdote asistente y entrenador, que murió como prisionero de guerra japonés.

En 1945, los feligreses de Sta. Maria tenían un doble motivo de celebración. La guerra había terminado y la deuda de la iglesia estaba totalmente saldada. Además, celebraron el 25 aniversario como sacerdote de su amado pastor. Continuará
