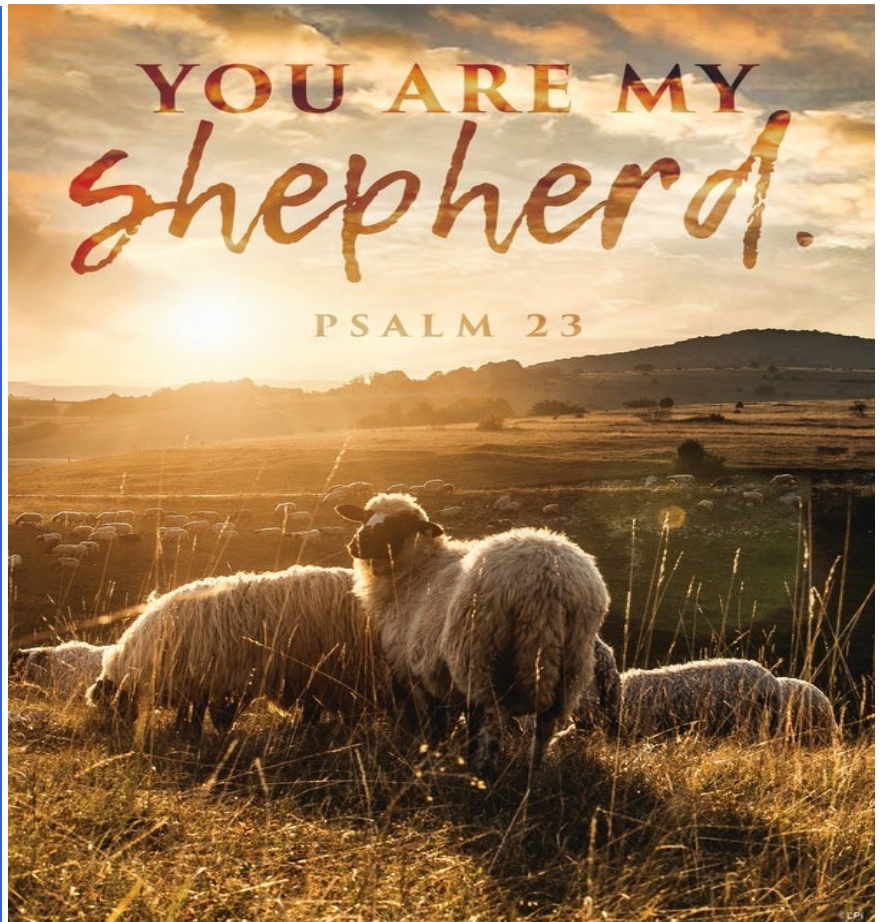

DID YOU KNOW THIS ABOUT ST. MARY?

Rev. Edmund Murnane 1950-1969

Monsignor Murnane accomplished more than just building new schools and creating new parishes. He also played a role in reorganizing and establishing social agencies and projects in Eugene. One of his key achievements was the establishment of Catholic Charities of Lane County, with offices in the Rectory and Frank Nearing serving as its director. Additionally, he reorganized the St. Vincent de Paul Society, hiring Harold C. McDonald as Executive Secretary, and managed the first Rummage Center to fund the charitable works of the Society. Although his plans for a retirement center did not materialize, he did succeed in establishing a home for unwed mothers of all creeds and races in 1966. These facilities were later repurposed as the Murnane Guest House, providing affordable housing for those receiving medical treatment at Sacred Heart Hospital and their families.

Dedicated to the spiritual development of his congregation, Monsignor Murnane expanded the schedule of Sunday masses to accommodate the growing number of parishioners. Additionally, he reinstated the practice of nocturnal adoration in St. Patrick's Chapel, located in the Convent, which had begun in the mid-1940s. He also organized the Nocturnal Adoration Society. It is said that he was inspired by Monsignor (Bishop) Fulton J. Sheen, whom he had met while traveling in the East.

Monsignor Murnane aimed to establish a contemplative community in his parish, and he reached an agreement with the nuns of the Carmel of St. Therese in Alhambra, California to establish a monastery. In 1957, they purchased a house on Greenhill Drive, west of Eugene. Mother Miriam of Jesus and six other nuns arrived on November 4. The first Mass at the Carmel of Maria Regina was celebrated on November 6, 1957.

A Deserted Place

In one of my favorite shows, "Parks and Recreation," there is a scene where one of the characters, Jerry, is tasked with stuffing hundreds of envelopes with flyers as part of his volunteer work for a local city council campaign.

Jerry's efficient, almost mechanical completion of the job amazes his coworkers, who gather to watch in awe while he folds, inserts, seals, and stamps – over and over again. After several hours, the huge pile of envelopes is finally ready for mailing ... and Jerry realizes that he has stuffed them all with the wrong piece of paper.

"I always say, it ain't government work unless you do it twice," he quips as he restarts the task.

In any work, no matter how worthy or fulfilling it is, there is a point where the task transforms into mere routine. It can happen with anything: ministry, marriage, parenthood, even prayer. There is no shame in this. It doesn't mean that we don't enjoy these pursuits or feel passion for the mission inherent in them.

It only means that we are human, and we get tired.

When the Apostles return from their travels, Jesus recognizes their exhaustion. He encourages them to "come away to a deserted place." He inhabits a human body, so he knows the weariness to which it is subject. He knows what it is to be tired, to be hungry. He knows that it's hard to do the work when your body is failing you.

It's important for us to recognize those times when Jesus is calling us to a deserted place – and it's important for us to follow him there, even if we are pursued by feelings of doubt and guilt, just as the Apostles were followed by crowds hungry for their ministry.

Solitude is not selfishness. Contemplation is not idleness. To withdraw does not mean to run away.

The work we do – whatever it is – deserves our whole strength. If we have lost that, there is only one place we are sure to find it again.

¿SABÍAS ESTO SOBRE SANTA MARÍA?

Rev. Edmund J. Murnane 1929 - 1950

Monseñor Murnane logró mucho más que simplemente construir nuevas escuelas y crear nuevas parroquias. También desempeñó un papel en la reorganización y el establecimiento de agencias y proyectos sociales en Eugene. Uno de sus logros clave fue el establecimiento de Caridades Católicas del Condado de Lane, con oficinas en la Rectoría y Frank Nearing como su director. Además, reorganizó la Sociedad de San Vicente de Pablo, contrató a Harold C. McDonald como Secretario Ejecutivo y administró el primer Centro Hurgar para financiar las obras caritativas de la Sociedad. Aunque sus planes para un centro de retiro no se materializaron, logró establecer un hogar para madres solteras de todos los credos y razas en 1966. Estas instalaciones fueron posteriormente reutilizadas como la Casa de Huéspedes Murnane, que proporciona alojamiento asequible para quienes reciben tratamiento médico en Hospital Sagrado Corazón y sus familias.

Dedicado al desarrollo espiritual de su congregación, monseñor Murnane amplió el horario de las misas dominicales para dar cabida al creciente número de feligreses

Además, restableció la práctica de la adoración nocturna en la Capilla de San Patricio, ubicada en el Convento, que se había iniciado a mediados de la década de 1940. También organizó la Sociedad de Adoración Nocturna. Se dice que se inspiró en Monseñor (Obispo) Fulton J. Sheen, a quien había conocido mientras viajaba por el Este.

Monseñor Murnane quería fundar una comunidad contemplativa en su parroquia. Negoció con las monjas del Carmelo de Santa Teresa en Alhambra, California, para establecer un monasterio. En 1957, compraron una casa en Greenhill Drive, al oeste de Eugene. La Madre Miriam de Jesús y otras seis monjas llegaron el 4 de noviembre. La primera Misa en el Carmelo de María Regina se celebró el 6 de noviembre de 1957. Continuará
